- Area A (Green): Eastern footpath connecting Northbrook Road.
- Area B (Orange): Central pedestrian link between Areas A and C.
- Area C (Purple): Internal pedestrian footpath.

INITIAL INSPECTION – 16 JULY 2026 (AREA A)

Vegetation growth is present across the width of the footpath, reducing the usable walking surface. Weeds are emerging through paving joints and along the path edges, creating an untidy appearance and increasing maintenance requirements.

Vegetation clearance was completed as part of an Elijah Decimus – Community Projects & Local Advocacy initiative. The vegetation has been removed from the footpath and the usable walking surface has been significantly improved. The route was clear for pedestrians at the time of the final inspection. Continued routine maintenance by Lewisham Council Highways is recommended to prevent future overgrowth.
